

***Dear Georgetown Resident:***

Welcome to the NIH! We hope you enjoy your month with us. We apologize in advance that you will probably get lost on the campus, but people here are generally very helpful!

In order to help make the most out of your experience here, we have provided this outline for you.

On the first day of your rotation here, please see Maryellen Rechen, who will help to get you situated and will give you the instructions to get your ID badge, etc. Her contact info is: *maryellen.rechen@nih.gov*, 301-496-8368. Her office is located on the 5<sup>th</sup> floor of the Hatfield Clinical Center in room 5-2571.

Please page/call Dr. Maya Lodish, the deputy program director for the pediatric endocrinology fellowship, after you have met with Maryellen on your first day. The page operator number is 301-496-1211, from outside of NIH, or inside NIH dial 102 and then her pager ID, 11849. If you would rather call directly, the number is 301 451-7175, or email [lodishma@mail.nih.gov](mailto:lodishma@mail.nih.gov). Dr. Lodish will meet with you on your first day in order to go over the goals and objectives of the rotation. In addition, we will look over your schedule in order to figure out which days you will be at the NIH and when you have other commitments (continuity clinic and ICU call). She will also put you in touch with the teaching attending for the month.

Every resident is expected to give a presentation to the fellows and attendings at the Thursday 9 AM pediatric case conference- usually the resident presentation is on the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of the month. Generally, the resident picks an interesting patient he/she has seen or a topic to learn more about and prepares a 30-45 minute power point presentation. The teaching attending of the month as well as Dr. Lodish are both available to help provide guidance. If the resident is unable to be present on a Thursday morning, we will arrange for the presentation at another time, as the presentation is part of the requirements of the rotation.

In addition, residents should pick up 1-2 new pediatric endocrine patients each Monday that they are at the NIH; they will be asked to perform a history and physical and present the patient to the teaching attending and the fellow on service. Because most admissions are planned ahead of time, you should ask the fellow on service which patients are expected to be admitted, so you will have a chance to choose which patients interest you and ideally to read more about their particular diagnoses ahead of time.

Please look at the weekly schedule provided- you will be expected to attend the conferences in bold when you are at the NIH; the others are optional, but highly educational.
